MILESTONE ELECTION, INTERESTING TECHNICAL PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT VICKSBURG MEETING

Forty Five members of the Deep South Section ITE gathered at the Riverwalk Casino Resort in Vicksburg, Mississippi for their Fall meeting October 10 and 11. The meeting venue, with spectacular views overlooking the mighty Mississippi River, featured a broad technical program and enjoyable social activities. One of the meeting highlights was the announcement of the election results for 2013:

Suzanne Dees, MDOT—Vice President
Nicole Harris-Stewart, Urban Systems, Inc.— Secretary Treasurer

This marks the first time in the history of the Deep South ITE that all three of the annually elected positions will be held by women, representing a continuing trend of expanding opportunities and diversity in the transportation engineering profession.

Jeff Smith of Temple, Inc. will continue to serve as ABD representative and Scott Boyle of LADOTD will continue in his two-year elected term as Section Representative to the Southern District ITE.

TECHNICAL PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Wes Dean, Assistant Chief Engineer of Field Operations with Mississippi DOT, welcomed the group and outlined some of the innovative projects being implemented by MDOT. Jay Bockisch of Gresham, Smith and Partners continued the technical agenda, discussing *Criteria to Determine Implementation of Innovative Intersection Concepts*, including justification for new ideas such as the CFI, Double Crossover (Diverging) Diamond, and "Florida T" designs. After Hibbett Neel of Neel-Schaffer, Inc. discussed *The Value of ITE to the Transportation Profession* (see related article), Larry Smith of the Central Mississippi Planning and Development District talked about *Developing the 2035 Jackson Urbanized Area Transportation Plan*, which included some interesting photos of Jackson from the 1960's and 70's. Mike Stokes of MDOT's ITS Section talked about *MS River Bridges Incident Management, Freight Movement and Security Project* including how ITS applications are helping not only bridge traffic flow, but safety for river traffic as well.

After a break, Jeff Smith of Temple introduced his guest, Tom Cuenen of OTN Systems, who talked about *Reliable Communications Networks for ITS* and some of the applications used by MDOT, after which Huey Dugas of the Capital Regional Planning Commission in Baton Rouge discussed *Education for the Transportation Professional in the 21st Century*, featuring some of his research on demographic issues related to staffing in transportation, and related topics. Dean Tekell of Dean Tekell Consulting then talked about *Future MUTCD Changes Proposed by the FHWA* for the next edition of the Manual, and the afternoon was wrapped up with a discussion session on Ethics, led by the always engaging Roger Shields of Neel-Schaffer, Inc.

AWARDS AND OTHER (!) HIGHLIGHTS

As with all DSITE functions, time was reserved for renewing old friendships and making new ones at the social hour, followed by a buffet dinner and presentation of Deep South Section awards for outstanding service in the previous year. DSITE President Jonathan Kiser presented the President's Award to Suzanne Dees, Secretary-Treasurer, for her efforts in organizing meetings, producing the newsletter, and overall contributions to the group. Suzanne is the Traffic / ITS Engineer for MDOT in the Hattiesburg District.

Strength for outstanding service in the public sector. Steve is the District Traffic Operations Engineer for Louisiana DOTD in New Orleans. The Dart-Epps Award for outstanding service in the Academic Community went to Dr. Waheed Uddin of the University of Mississippi Department of Civil Engineering. Dr. Uddin is Faculty Advisor to the Ole Miss ITE Student Chapter, and his award will be presented at their next Student Chapter meeting. The Past President's Award went to Brad Engels for his service in 2011. Brad is an Engineer in the Jackson office of ABMB Engineers, Inc.

USACE TECHNICAL TOUR

The following morning, after a breakfast buffet and business meeting, DSITE attendees toured the Engineer Research and Development Center (ERDC) of the US Army Corps of Engineers. On the site of the former Waterways Experiment Station, Deep South members learned how ERDC not only conducts research on ports and waterways, but a variety of engineering applications designed to keep our troops safe, help us defend the

homeland against terrorism, and teach us more about the environment and causes and effects of river flooding. The tour included stops at the pavement research facility, where a dynamic loading machine was demonstrated to show how runway pavements are tested, a simulator where real river pilots can evaluate the navigational effects of waterway improvements, and a tour of one of the worlds largest materials testing laboratories.

LEGENDS OF THE DEEP SOUTH: W. HIBBETT NEEL, JR., P.E.

The Deep South Section is extremely proud to have one of its own, Hibbett Neel, elected to serve as International Vice President of ITE for 2013. Hibbett is a founding member of the Deep South Division (Section) and served as our first President. He has held every office at the Section and District levels and served on the International Board from the Southern District from 1994-96. He has also served on and chaired numerous committees at all levels of ITE. One of the topics that Hibbett takes special interest in is the teaching and discussion of Ethics as part of our professional development, and he served as Chair of the ITE Ethics Task Force for six years. His professional philosophy can be summed up in a statement on his ITE Profile page, "Work hard, help people, be a part of your community."

Deep South members in attendance at the Vicksburg meeting had the pleasure of hearing Hibbett speak about *The Value of ITE to the Transportation Profession* during the afternoon technical program. Hibbett's theme was "Vision with action can accomplish anything." Some of the key points of value to the group that Hibbett talked about and also featured in his campaign for International office include:

1. ITE is relevant to current issues, including the challenges of dealing with traffic congestion, safety, and promoting healthy lifestyles through biking and walking activities and complete streets and sustainable communities projects.
2. ITE is a great source of technical information with many new resources available such as webinars, the e-library, and the

ITE community website, along with its traditionally excellent publications and journals.

3. ITE is an excellent place to develop leadership skills and gain experience in dealing with people, and to learn from colleagues through shared experiences and successes.
4. ITE is a place where life-long friendships are developed and nurtured through association with other professionals who love what they do.

Hibbett also encouraged the members to get involved with ITE at all levels by:

1. Working to strengthen Student Chapters, which helps develop our profession's leaders of the future.
2. Joining the ITE Community as a way to share technical and professional information.
3. Joining and participating in Technical Councils. Each ITE membership includes one Technical Council membership and additional councils can be added at nominal cost.
4. Using our skills and knowledge to educate public officials on the value of transportation to our communities, our economy, and our world.
5. Sharing examples of our successes with other members, elected leaders, and members of the community as a whole.



Hibbett serves as President of Neel-Schaffer, Inc. of Jackson. He credits his firm's success in part to strongly supporting involvement of his employees in ITE. He has received many honors for his professional activities including the Burton W. Marsh Award by ITE, and the Marble J. Hensley and Herman Hoos Awards of the Southern District.

BUSINESS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

October 12, 2012 Vicksburg, MS

Vice-President Gaby Tassin called the meeting to order.

President's Report:

President Jonathan Kiser was not able to attend the meeting due to a previously scheduled ITE-related obligation. His comments are included in the Vice-President's report.

Business Meeting (continued)**Vice President's Report:**

Vice President Gaby Tassin discussed the schedule for the 2013 Deep South meetings. The previously scheduled dates were in conflict with the 2013 Super Bowl to be held in New Orleans. A decision was made to move the meeting dates to February 27 – March 1, with Leadership Series Sessions held on February 27. Tentative dates for the Summer Meeting and Fall Meeting are June 5 – 7 and October 10 – 11, 2013.

Gaby made a motion for Deep South to begin using permanent name badges in place of temporary nametags. Diane Callahan made a second and the motion carried. Gaby also made a motion that only the DSITE Secretary/Treasurer have access to and be allowed to send emails using the DSITE contact information database. Jeff Smith made a second and the motion carried.

Election Results:

Voting in this year's officers election was done almost entirely online. Prasanth Malisetty did a great job setting up the online voting system. A few paper ballots were cast in this election. Those ballots were counted and totaled with the online votes. With a total of 70 members voting in the election, Nicole Stewart received a majority of the votes and was elected Secretary/Treasurer for 2013.

Secretary/Treasurer's Report:

Secretary/Treasurer Suzanne Dees reported a checking account balance of \$23,575.54 and a scholarship account balance of \$24,632.05. This checking account balance did not reflect income and expenses related to the Fall Meeting. Income from the meeting totaled \$1376.33 after applying meeting expenses and ABD donations. Deep South currently has 180 dues-paid members.

Section Representative's Report:

Section Representative Scott Boyle gave a brief summary of the Section information he provided to Becky White prior to this year's Southern District meeting. Scott plans to attend the District's year-end board meeting in Georgia.

ABD Report:

Jeff Smith mentioned that Temple, Inc. associates David Roberts and Jay Montgomery were present for the fall meeting. Jeff O'Brian with Econolite and Mark Melancon with Intelligent Transportation Systems also participated in the meeting. Members thanked Temple and Econolite for their contributions toward the cost of the Fall Meeting.

Publications:

Steve Strength has volunteered to take over the publication of Deep South News. Steve shared some interesting ideas he has for upcoming issues. Steve plans to have one issue out by the end of October and another out at the end of the year. Members who would like to contribute information or articles should contact Steve. Members agreed that the DSITE Secretary/Treasurer would continue to receive and document Newsletter Ad payments.

Steve suggested creating a link between Deep South ITE and Louisiana's Destination Zero Deaths calendar, particularly for the benefit of the Mississippi members.

Gaby encouraged members to invite consultants who join our group to advertise in the newsletter. Advertisers have asked Gaby

about the possibility of purchasing differing ad sizes. Members discussed this and agreed that all newsletter ads will remain the size of a business card.

Technical:

Prasanth Malisetty will continue to oversee the online voting system. Prasanth volunteered to help with the Deep South website and also to set up an online meeting registration system.

**Scholarship:**

Susan Treadway has been named the Chair of the scholarship committee; Doug Robert will remain a member of the committee.

Students:

Gaby Tassin stated that Paul Forster will no longer serve as Student Chapter Liaison or as Student Chapter Committee Chair. Robert Lee has expressed an interest in the role of Student Chapter Committee Chair.

2015 Southern District Meeting:

Jeff Smith discussed the 2015 Southern District Meeting to be held in Biloxi, MS. Jeff and Shane Bergin are currently listed as meeting co-chairs. Shane is looking to relocate to Alabama and Deep South will ultimately need someone else to serve in his position as co-chair. Southern District has signed a contract with the Beau Rivage that is basically an extension of the 2005 contract that was not fulfilled due to Hurricane Katrina. Many aspects of the first contract are included in the current contract. Members who are located near the Gulf Coast agreed to assist with the meeting.

With no further business to attend, the meeting was adjourned.

MDOT, BILOXI, BEAU RIVAGE HOST TWO NATIONAL MEETINGS

MDOT hosted two national meetings relating to Traffic and Transportation this fall at the celebrated Beau Rivage Casino Resort in Biloxi. Attended by many Deep South members, several were also involved in the technical programs and local Meeting arrangements. The National Rural ITS (NRITS) conference was held September 16-19 in conjunction with the Gulf

Region ITS (GRITS) Annual Meeting. Attendees were treated to a technical program that emphasized ITS applications for Safety and Efficiency, Incident Management and Special Events topics, and a seminar on Integrated Corridor Management, along with a large exhibit area featuring the latest ITS technologies. Social activities included an opening reception at poolside overlooking the Gulf of Mexico, an evening out for barbeque at The Shed in Ocean Springs, and a sponsored dinner at Jimmy Buffett's Margaritaville. GRITS is the chapter of ITS America for members in Mississippi, Louisiana, and Alabama and includes Traffic and Transportation Engineers as well as technical and industry representatives in the ITS field. NRITS is the national organization for rural ITS applications. Acey Roberts served as Local Arrangements Chair for the meeting, assisted by numerous MDOT representatives.

Focus on Traffic Records

The annual renewal of the Traffic Records Forum of the Association of Transportation Safety Information Professionals (ATSIP) took place at the Beau Rivage October 28-31. Again MDOT employees worked hard to host and make this meeting a success. Technical subjects focused on traffic crash reporting methods, statistical analysis, and training on application of the Highway Safety Manual. An opening reception, technical exhibits, and two luncheons with technical speakers were included in the program, and attendees also were afforded time to enjoy evening activities at the Beau Rivage along with some of the restaurants in the downtown Biloxi area. ATSIIP focuses on improving crash data reporting and analysis along with other engineering, enforcement and educational pursuits designed to make highways and streets safer in the United States and Canada. Dan Magri of LADOTD received a special award from the group for his efforts in promoting the organization and its work over the years, while Hadi Shirazi of LADOTD ended the second of his two years of dedicated service as ATSIIP President.

The recently renovated Beau Rivage will serve as the site of the Southern District ITE Annual Meeting in the spring of 2015. Interestingly, the venue was scheduled to host the 2006 SDITE Annual meeting, but heavy damage from Hurricane Katrina in August 2005 forced relocation of that meeting to Jackson.

LADOTD AND LTAP HELPING LOCALS NAVIGATE PROJECT PITFALLS

Helping Local Public Agencies (LPA's) develop and administer projects using Federal and State aid transportation funding is the goal of a new training program and manual developed by Louisiana DOTD. The LPA Qualification Program has been developed to assist locals in understanding policies, procedures and practices of these programs in order to help them take advantage of their benefits and understand their requirements under State and Federal laws and regulations. To accomplish this, DOTD enlisted the help of the Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) at LSU to develop a training program for local elected and appointed officials, consulting engineers, and others involved in administering Local Road Safety Program, Safe Routes to School, Enhancement, Rail Crossing Safety, Local STP/Urban, and similar projects. The new training classes were administered at 10 locations across the State this fall, with key DOTD project personnel helping with the teaching, according to Dr. Marie Walsh, Director of Louisiana LTAP. Having the DOTD project people involved allows participants the opportunity to hear directly from those who administer the programs and promotes communication between DOTD and the locals.

DOTD LPA Coordinator Ann Wills, who developed the companion LPA Manual for the training, says LPA project sponsors and their consultants will be required to attend the core training to be qualified to participate in the state and federal programs on future transportation projects. More information can be obtained on the web at dotd.la.gov under "LPA Qualifications Training."
